# 18/70 County Cllr & District Cllr Updates

Cllr Shirley, DDDC, did not attend, though he had emailed to say he would be present. Cllr Bull was in attendance. Cllr Bull had no updates for the Parish Council as there are no Committee meetings in August.

Cilr Hall and Clir Naylor reported back on the informal inter parish meeting held on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> August, 3 Clirs from Osmaston and Yeldersley Parish Council were in attendance. The meeting was also attended by Clirs from Bradley (3 Clirs), Shirley (1 Clir) and Clifton (2 Clirs) Parish Councils. The majority of Clirs in attendance wanted to discuss the proposed Ashbourne bypass. In addition Clirs wished to discuss the planning applications for the airfield – Clir Shirley is no longer on the Planning Committee so didn't know anything about the applications. An amiable discussion about the planning applications followed. Clirs made it clear to Clir Shirley that the parishes would appreciate the opportunity for more input in regard to the airfield planning applications.

Clir Bull said in regard to the proposed bypass that the feasibility study is next, and this will go out to public consultation. Clir Naylor asked about the proposed new road for the airfield. Clir Bull said it's at a standstill due to objections to the proposed traffic lights.

# 18/71 Police Update

PCSO David Seabridge was in attendance. David said that currently there were only 1 f/t and 1 p/t Police Officer covering Ashbourne, working between 8am – 4.30pm but this will improve. He had checked back over the last four months at the crime rate in the area and there had been a couple of burglaries. There was nothing much to report on the motorbikes on the airfield – in April motorcyclists were caught loading bikes into a van and were given warning letters. The Police are liaising with Ashbourne Town Council (ATC) who have been working with JCB to improve security on the airfield. ATC are considering installing a better fence which would be part funded by ATC and JCB. PCSO Seabridge hopes to find out more at ATC's meeting on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> September. Cllr Naylor reported that there is a gap on the left-hand side of the airfield (A52). David said that a lot of the bikes aren't road legal so are being transported by van.

Cllr Cranstone raised concerns about parking during term time (8:50 – 9:15am drop off and Afternoon pick ups by parents). Cars are being parked down Moor Lane and Church Lane, parking on the junctions, reducing or restricting visibility. Cars are having to pull out on the wrong side of the road into oncoming traffic. David offered to come out and

monitor when available – police guidance notices can be put on windscreens. Cllrs also raised concerns about parking outside the last house on the left towards Wyaston as vehicles are parking on the bend. David will flag this with Traffic. Cllr Hall let David know that the ploughing match is coming to Osmaston on 3<sup>rd</sup> October so a one way system will be needed. Cllr Cranstone said that he had been told that a Shirley residents was hoping to set up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme - David was aware of this and said it was a legitimate scheme. Cllr Hall thanked David for attending.
