18/85 County Cllr & District Cllr Updates

Cllr Bull, Derbyshire County Council sent apologies. There was no response from Cllr Shirley.

18/86 Police Update

Cllr Cranstone has been in touch with Hugh Tyler, of the Neighbourhood Watch in Shirley. Osmaston and Yeldersley don't have a Neighbourhood Watch representative. Cllr Cranstone has asked Hugh to send him information on Neighbourhood Watch activities. He asked if Cllrs could identify a parishioner who might be interested in taking the role.

18/87 Update - Vital Earth

Cllr Naylor attended a Vital Earth meeting in October. The pending planning application will not be going ahead as tonnage has significantly decreased. The smells have decreased. The next meeting will be in April 2019.

18/88 Highways / Rights of Way

Update on jobs reported to Highways

There are no jobs waiting attention.

Cllrs noted that the roads seem to be in reasonable condition.

The VAS is working – Derbyshire County Council are maintaining it.

Cllr Naylor reported that Ladyhole Lane has had new cattle grids.

Cllr Hall confirmed that the grit bin(s) had been filled.

There have not been any volunteers for the Snow Warden roles in either Osmaston or Yeldersley. It was noted that farmers keep the lanes clear.

Items for reporting to Highways

There are no items for reporting.

Parking - School

Cllr Cranstone took 15 minutes to get from the pub to Church Lane because of parking / traffic. Cllr Hall reported traffic jams on the school rurr. Cllr Cranstone think they need school entrance markings / double yellow lines. Cllr Hall reported that the school has written to parents asking them not to stop / park on Church Lane.

Action: Write to Okeover for their views on white / yellow lanes and express concern re parking at school start / end of day

Action: Write to Highways – what is the position on the installation of double yellow lines or school markings? What would the procedures be in a conservation area? CC Police Commissioner (r) – we have asked Police to monitor and no-one has come CC Head of School

FP 1 Yeldersley (from Yeldersley Hall to Church Lane). Tenant has crops across the path. Yeldersley FP 2 – the path on ground has disappeared and needs reinstating (from Derby Road to west of A52).

Information Board

Clerk and Cllr Hall created a draft information board. Cllr Hall took it to Acres Graphics and left it with them to produce a mock up.

Village Hall Car Park

Cllr Cranstone asked if in principle the Parish Council could consider supporting a potential planning application by the Village Hall Committee for a proposed extension of the Village Hall car park. Cllr Cranstone has quotes for the extension to the Village Hall car park on behalf of the Memorial Hall and is going to write to the School asking if they can provide 50%. A change of use would be required. Cllrs asked if parents would use the car park. Cllr Hall thought they would. Cllrs agreed that they would in principle support any potential planning application, and would consider an application for a Parish Council grant towards costs.

Action: Clerk to write to the Estate confirming that the Parish Council is prepared to offer support to the village Hall Committee for a proposed extension of the village hall car park

CCTV

The Clerk provided information to Cllrs about CCTV provision in Hathersage and Duffield parishes.

Action: Clerk to research costs of CCTV and contact Hathersage and Duffield Councils for advice including problems they hadn't seen

18/91 Planning

Applications: Planning Application 18/00767/VCOND - Variation of Conditions 6 and 7 of Planning Permission 14/00074/OUT to allow a start to be made onsite prior to the road improvements being completed

Additional information was sent to the Parish Council for information only. Cllrs commented that they still believe that services should be installed first, before any houses are built on site. There is also concern about the site being accessed off Ladyhole Lane. The issue of increased traffic has still not been addressed.

Coronation Cottages, Osmaston

A parishioner had asked if the new windows installed by the Okeover Estate at Coronation Cottages were in keeping with the requirements of a conservation area. It was confirmed by Cllr Hall that the windows are in line with requirements.

which are no longer available due to the Travellers' occupation, reducing the availability of parking spaces in Ashbourne. Cllrs agreed.
